Winter at Taylor Creek saw more snow and more rain. (Photos above are from December & February) Toogee Sielsch, our South Lake Tahoe Director, kept extra water off trails by notching the far side of the beaver dam – the creek is really full right now, and we suspect the beavers have moved down to the lower beaver pond. There is plenty of water for them, but the high flows make dam repair difficult.
